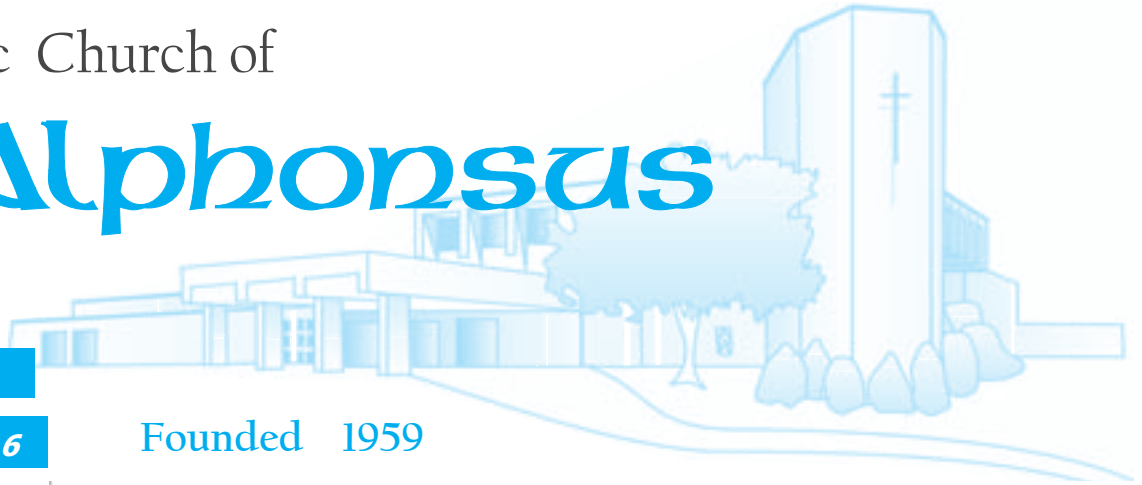

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In the recent Knight's of Columbus newsletter there was a reflective synopsis on some current affairs in our United States. The comments are those of Gene Hippe, State Deputy of the Knights of Columbus. I quote:

"Is it more important for a bird egg to develop and come to full term and hatch than a baby to be born? A person will be penalized severely under the law for destroying an eagle's egg but he can kill a human fetus in the womb with no legal consequences. Think about it! What is wrong with this set of priorities? What is wrong with this kind of ethics? If we can pass a constitutional amendment to increase our sales tax to help protect the environment, why won't our legislatures allow us to vote on a constitutional amendment to define and protect the sanctity of a traditional marriage? Why can't we vote on the issue of abortion rather than have the Supreme Court make the rules? Why are we being threatened with the Freedom of Choice Act (FOCA)? Think about it!"

Knight Hippe raises some very important questions about our priorities as a nation. The Catholic Church has consistently taught about the sanctity of all human life, from conception to natural death. Our Catholic faith has a strong social justice ethic in regards to the dignity of persons in their rights to employment, just wage, housing, and the migration of peoples all over the world. There are no easy answers and solutions to these many issues. But we as a Christian people must adhere to sound moral values and principles and work in the Church to unite all peoples of all races and cultures into the one family of God.

In "Strangers No Longer: Together on the Journey of Hope," January 22, 2003, the Catholic Bishops of the United States and Mexico stated jointly: "The Holy Spirit has been present throughout the history of the Church to work against injustice, division, and oppression and to bring about respect for individual human rights, unity of races and cultures, and the incorporation of the marginalized into full life in the Church."

Our work as the People of God is never complete, but may we do our best to "accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work." (From a prayer by Bishop Ken Untener, commonly referred to as the *Romero Prayer*)
